NATO-UKRAINE ANNUAL TARGET PLAN FOR 2005

1. Please find attached the draft NATO-Ukraine Annual Target Plan (ATP) for 2005. The document outlines activities that Ukraine plans to undertake with the aim of achieving the objectives of the NATO-Ukraine Action Plan, as well as joint NATO-Ukraine activities foreseen for the year. The ATP complements other existing NATO and EAPC work plans and programmes including, inter alia, the Military Committee + Ukraine 2005 Work Plan, the Joint Working Group on Defence Reform Programme of Activities for 2004-2005, and the NATO Special Committee 2005 Work Programme.

2. Unless I hear to the contrary **by 12 noon on Wednesday, 16 February 2005**, I shall consider the joint NATO-Ukraine actions set out in the ATP as endorsed by the Commission, and the proposed Ukrainian actions as noted. The document will then be sent for final signature to President Yushchenko, declassified and prepared for simultaneous publication on NATO and Ukrainian websites under agreed modalities.

3. The mid-year review process will offer the opportunity to refine and refocus the ATP as required.

I.2. ECONOMIC ISSUES
