

## **EADRCC EXERCISE SITUATION REPORT N° 1 ON TERRORIST ATTACK IN ROMANIA**

Exercise/Dacia 2003//

### 1. Update on the Situation in Romania

1.1. At 08:00 hrs local time 8 September 2003 another explosion occurred in Pitesti killing approx. 20 people and injuring more than 200. The blast affected an area of more than 1.5 sqkm. The first measurement indicates that a Radiological Dispersion Device (Dirty Bomb) was used. The hospitals in Pitesti are confronted with an increasing number of injured people, and do not have specialised services for irradiation treatment. A large number of injured people will therefore be transported to a specialised hospital in Bucharest.

The second explosion is also claimed by EMANON.

The Romanian Civil Protection Command has informed the EADRCC that other explosions have occurred in different locations in Bucharest and Craiova, however, without casualties.
