

EADRCC EXERCISE SITUATION REPORT N° 1 ON TERRORIST ATTACK IN ROMANIA

Exercise/Dacia 2003

1. Background information, ref Exercise instruction EAPC(SCEPC)N(2003)3-REV2
 - 1.1. On 3 October 2003, a number of heavy explosions occurred in Bucharest, Ploiesti and Pitesti. All these explosions were claimed by the terrorist group "EMANON".
 - 1.2. On 6 October 2003 at 20:00 (local time) during a football match, an explosion occurred near to the Trivale football stadium in Pitesti, some 100 north west of Bucharest. Twenty people were killed. Immediately after the explosion, local authorities received an anonymous phone call, claiming that EMANON was responsible for the explosion and that a "dirty bomb" had been exploded. They also announced similar attacks against water and power supply stations, the gas network and hotels and supermarkets. Measurements in the vicinity of the stadium confirmed the use of a Radiological Dispersion Device ("dirty bomb").
 - 1.3. Despite a massive mobilisation of national resources it was soon clear that international assistance was needed. On Tuesday 7 October 2003 at 01:00 (local time) the Romanian Government appealed for international assistance through the Euro-Atlantic Disaster Response Coordination Centre (EADRCC).
 - 1.4. The same day, at 03:00 (local time) the EADRCC distributed an "Exercise - Urgent Request for International Disaster Assistance" to the Initial Points of Contacts in EAPC countries and started its coordination tasks in close cooperation with relevant international organisations.
