

## **EADRCC EXERCISE SITUATION REPORT N° 3 ON TERRORIST ATTACK IN ROMANIA**

Exercise/Dacia 2003//

### 1. Update on the Situation in Romania

1.1. According to the latest information from the LEMA a new explosion of a "Dirty Bomb" occurred on 8 October 2003 at 11:00 in a low-density area of Pitesti. Nine persons were killed and seventeen injured. Seventy persons had to be evacuated.

1.2. To prevent further terrorist attacks the Romanian authorities has deployed a large number of security units in the area. However, despite all efforts of security forces and intelligence service, there is no certain information regarding the possible future targets for the terrorist activities. There are no problems with public order.

1.3. The number of contaminated persons, stemming from the three explosions, is still to be determined. The contaminated area is approximately 2 km<sup>2</sup>. The proximity areas of the explosions (100m radius) are highly contaminated and sealed off. Future access control measures are being considered.

1.4. The Water Pumping Station is still out of order after the explosion 7 October 2003.

### 2. Deployment of National and International Response

2.1. On 8 October 2003 the disaster response operations were focused mainly on:

- Radiological reconnaissance and monitoring, including mapping of gamma rates
- Search and rescue operations
- Establishments of temporary shelters, including a camp for evacuees
- Medical screening, evaluation and stabilisation
- Equipment and personnel decontamination
