

EADRCC EXERCISE SITUATION REPORT N° 4 ON TERRORIST ATTACK IN ROMANIA FINAL REPORT

Exercise/Dacia 2003//

1. Update on the Situation in Romania

1.1. According to the latest information from the LEMA, the situation in Pitesti is under control. Due to the security actions taken and the close cooperation with neighbouring countries, there has been no terrorist activity during the last 24 hours. The contaminated areas are precisely defined. Heavy rainfalls have reduced the radiation level in the affected areas.

1.2. The radiological screening has continued. Ten persons were decontaminated and evacuated to the county hospital.

1.3. The Water Pumping Station is still out of order after the explosion on 7 October 2003. The scarce supply of clean water is causing problems.

1.4. There is no need for international assistance any longer. The teams have started to redeploy.

2. Deployment of National and International Response

2.1. On 9 October 2003 the disaster response operations were focused mainly on:

- Radiological reconnaissance and monitoring, including mapping of gamma rates
- Search and rescue operations
- Medical screening, evaluation and stabilisation
- Equipment and personnel decontamination
- Demining

2.2. The Local Emergency Management Authority (LEMA) deployed and tasked the national and international teams in the affected areas as follows:
