

EADRCC EXERCISE SITUATION REPORT N° 3 ON EXERCISE FERGHANA 2003

Exercise/Ferghana 2003

1. Background

1.1. On Sunday 27 April 2003, at 04:30 local time (ZULU+3 hours), an earthquake measuring seven on the Richter scale occurred in the Ferghana region, with its epicentre in Vodil Settlement near Ferghana City

1.2. Update on the Situation in Uzbekistan

1.2.1. According to the latest information from LEMA there are significant destruction of inhabited and administrative buildings and other constructions. In a number of structures there were fires. Earthquake has caused huge damage to infrastructures of communication, automobile and railroads and irrigation networks. Supply of potable water and the electric power in affected areas of the Ferghana area is completely interrupted.

1.2.2. According to the assessment of the situation, as a result of the earthquake, there are 7020 injured, 260 dead, 5860 houses, 220 social and industrial structures are totally collapsed.

2. Operations and Deployment of teams

By the decision of LEMA , national and international SAR teams were deployed in the affected zones as follows:

2.3. In addition the following elements have been deployed:

2.3.1. The Estonian Field Medical Hospital was deployed to receive and render medical aid to victims of the emergency. Field medical hospital treated 28 patients with different injuries.

2.3.2. Advance SAR teams from Poland and UK are assessing the not assessed areas.

2.3.3. A technical support team from Germany conducted work on supplying potable water.

2.3.4. A joint Swiss/Austrian team is cooperating with OXFAM performing water analysis and mid- and long-term plan for water provision in cooperation with LEMA.

2.3.5. Medecins Sans Frontiers (MSF) France has arrived with a team of two doctors and three nurses. Two teams of five doctors, five nurses and ten logisticians each from Protection Civile, France have arrived.

2.3.6. 24 staff from International Federation of Red Cross and the Red Crescent Society (IFRC) is providing medical treatment in Vodil Settlement.

2.3.7. A Dutch Disaster Assessment and Response Team (DART) has arrived for shelters, waters, sanitation's, medical and health needs assessments.

2.4. In total, from the affected zones, 195 people were rescued and 53 persons were found dead.

3. New requirements for assistance

3.1. Tents, beds, bedding, medical materials, potable water supply installations (equipment).

4. New problems

4.1. Some teams have reported the initial problems with coordination between rescue teams and local authorities.
