


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POSSIBLE EMERGENCY SITUATION IN TURKEY (Report Number 7 - 17 March 2003)

1. Situation

1.1. With the report at reference, the EADRCC promulgated to National Points of Contact for International Disaster Assistance an initial request for assistance related to a possible emergency situation in Turkey.

1.2. As of today, Canada, Croatia Hungary Norway and Poland have informed the EADRCC of offers of assistance to Turkey. Details of these offers are provided in Annex 1 to this report. Annex 2 to the report provides an overview of the outstanding requirements of Turkey.

1.3. Turkish authorities stressed again with the EADRCC that **Vaccines against Smallpox (initially 10.000 doses) and Anthrax (initially 50.000 doses), are the most urgent requirement.** Please note that in earlier reports 50.000 doses of Smallpox vaccines were requested.

1.4. Turkey is now preparing a vaccination implementation plan. The EADRCC has been informed that requirements for vaccines will need to be adjusted when the plan has been approved.

1.5. In the EADRCC report number 6, dated 14 March 2003, Gaziantep Airport was identified Airports of Debarcation (APOD) for the CBRN equipment. Today, the EADRCC has received conformation that also the airport of Van can be used for this equipment. The entry point for the Smallpox and Anthrax vaccines remains Esenboga Airport in Ankara.

1.6. In addition to the above mentioned APODs the Turkish authorities have informed the EADRCC that the following Seaports of Debarcation (SPODs) have been identified.

1.6.1. The Port of Mersin as the primary SPOD, with Iskenderun as additional primary SPOD after the use by the United States has completed.

1.7. For transportation coming by road, a land aid reception point has been established at Kapikule, at the Bulgarian Turkish Border. This land aid reception point can be activated upon request.

2. Transportation Request

2.1. Some of the nations offering assistance are not in a position to transport their offers of assistance.

2.2. Poland has requested transportation assistance for part of their offer of assistance to Turkey. The Polish cargo consists of 86 Euro-Pallets with a size of 0,8 by 1,2 metres. The height varies from 1 to 1,5 metres. The total volume of the load is approximately 110



cubic metres while the total weight is 19 tons. The cargo does not need special handling and is packed in wooden and cardboard boxes.

2.3. EAPC Nations in a position to assist Poland in the transportation of the cargo are therefore requested to examine whether they might be in a position to provide, **transportation capabilities** to assist those nations with the delivery of the assistance being offered.
