

1. According to Bulgarian authorities the situation has not improved since the last report of 20 July 05 and is still serious with flood levels still high in some areas. The Bulgarian authorities have provided video footage of the floods in the Rousse area along the Iskar river, which has been posted on the NATO website. 1.1 Approximately 10.000 people are still in need of assistance. Many animals have drowned as a result of the flooding and the precarious circumstances prevented their timely burying. In order to prevent epidemics, disinfecting substances are urgently needed. There is a heightened risk of epidemics due to impaired water supply and deterioration of drinking water.

1.2 National response teams continue with drainage works and the building of temporary dikes in endangered locations. Disinfecting activities in the affected areas continue. Evacuated people are given shelter and food.
