

1. The EADRCC received the following report from the Emergency Situations and Civil Safety Service, MIA of Georgia 08.05.05 at 16:20:

"The weather is back to normal in the affected regions, but the water level of the rivers still remains high. The weather forecast is positive.

Crisis management staff established on the spot intensively carries out road reconstruction work with a special attention on dissemination of humanitarian cargo.

In disaster regions the central system of water supply (2 km) is out of order; 80 km of electricity connections are damaged and considerable territory is without electricity; 577 houses and 154 other buildings have been ruined; about 802 hectares of agricultural land have been flooded; almost 229 animals died; 30,4 km of regional roads and 64,5 km of roads of special importance are seriously damaged; 69 bridges and 2,1 km of dam have been damaged and ruined.

Totally 9790 people are affected by the floods."
