

1. The EADRCC received over the past two weeks reports from the Emergency Situations and Civil Safety Service, MIA of Georgia and distributed these with six Situation Reports to the Points of Contact for International Response in NATO and Partner Countries.

2. In light of these Reports, several countries have provided resources in response to the flooding and landslide damage.

3. Meanwhile the UN has an initial two-person mission from UN-OCHA headquarters working with the various parts of the Government of Georgia and the UN-Disaster Management Team, which is led by the UN Resident Coordinator. Their main function is to help ensure adequate and effective international assistance to complement the actions of the Government

3.1.1. The EADRCC is in close contact with UN-OCHA, Geneva and received today the OCHA Situation Report No. 4 which is available on the OCHA Internet Website at [www.reliefweb.int](http://www.reliefweb.int)
