

1. Situation update:

1.1. We have been informed that the US Government (USG) started to notify nations whose national offers the US Government wishes to formally request as a matter of priority. Today, the USG has accepted some of the offers of assistance by Czech Republic, Denmark, Luxembourg, Norway, Romania, Slovak Republic and Slovenia (accepted items are indicated in tables in bold).

1.2. In light of this and with reference to the North Atlantic Council's (NAC's) decision on 9 September to offer NATO lift assets to transport requested items from Allied and Partner nations to the United States, EAPC nations are invited to utilise this Alliance capability in order to expeditiously move the requested assistance to the United States.

1.3. SACEUR, through its SACEUR OPLAN 10304 for the Provision of NATO Support to the US in Response to Hurricane Katrina will assist all EAPC nations in co-ordinating the movement of urgently needed material in support of humanitarian relief operations. It is envisaged that, for those most time-critical items, the SHAPE Allied Movement Co-ordination Centre (AMCC) will co-ordinate national offers of airlift. In this capacity, the AMCC will liaise with appropriate US transportation entities such as US Transportation Command and the US's Response Management Team's Operations Center.

1.4. Interested nations should immediately contact the Euro-Atlantic Disaster Response Co-ordination Centre (EADRCC) in order to request NATO airlift coordination. Nations who offered their assistance are requested to inform whether they will put their aid through the NATO-offered movement system.

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If yes, nations are kindly requested to provide essential planning data, e.g.: nature of item; volume/weight; special handling instructions, e.g. dangerous goods; notice to move/availability; location-where is this cargo; national willingness to move to a nominated hub(s) in Europe. Kindly provide this information by e-mail to the EADRCC.

**2. Further requirements for assistance will be communicated in due course.**

3. In order to avoid any unnecessary duplication of efforts EAPC nations are kindly invited to inform the EADRCC about the planned or already offered/provided assistance either on bilateral basis or in other co-ordination processes.
