

1. **Situation update:**

To date NATO has transported estimated 15.941 tents, 485.672 blankets, 16.820 heaters and 39.200 sleeping bags for the United Nations and of national aid donations via 151 flights carrying about 2.750 tons; figures provided are not final as some are still in the pipeline.

According to the Pakistan Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the relief assistance has been timely and substantial in providing shelter, and transporting tents and relief supplies to the affected areas. NATO relief flights constitute the largest single contribution to the relief airlift.

Winter clothing has become one of the top priority items. Donated winter clothing must not require cleaning and repair, it must be packed in waterproof packaging sorted by gender and size.

UNJLC reiterates the request for helicopter de-icing equipment. Helicopter operation relies upon making maximum use of the aircraft available. With winter arrived, much has been done to ensure the minimum disruption from deteriorating weather. As winter draws in and the days become shorter, it is essential to make maximum use of the reduced number of daylight flying hours – there is no routine flying in the mountains by night. As overnight temperatures drop below freezing access to helicopter de-icing equipment is becoming increasingly critical if valuable flying hours are not to be lost each morning. Helicopter mats from Indonesia arrived on 05 December 05.

As of 06 December 05, 41 EAPC nations have offered assistance to Pakistan on a bilateral basis, through NATO / EADRCC, through the EU Civil Protection Mechanism, through UN OCHA or other international organisations.

- i. Is the shipper willing to move the items to be shipped to the designated point of loading
- j. Specify any other special instructions
- k. Specify a telephone of Point of Contact (POC), and if possible alternative POC and the name of the person completing this questionnaire.

NOTE: It is important that each one of the 11 lines of the above questionnaire be completed. Please indicate NO if the answer is negative.

Nations are also invited to contribute airlift and sealift capability to NATO in order to expedite transportation of disaster relief from EAPC nations to Pakistan.
