

1. The Romanian General Inspectorate for Emergency Situations has provided the following updated information about the situation in the stricken area:

1.1 The total flooded area is approximately 170 square kilometres and some 5700 houses are affected and destroyed; many villages and towns are particularly affected. According to information from the Ministry of Waters and Environment flood levels are receding; water levels have dropped to between 0,8 - 1,2 metres due to the efficient work done by the intervention teams. The Teams from Hungary and Finland are still operating in the stricken areas under LEMA co-ordination and in close cooperation with Romanian intervention teams. The teams are pumping water from flooded basements. Local authorities are in the process of assessing the condition of flooded houses in order to prepare for reconstruction. Pest control activities are ongoing.

1.2 The German THW Team has suspended its operation and will leave the country on 2 June 2005.

1.3 Weather forecasts announce cloudy weather / rainfall / scattered storms for the next two days; temperatures will range between 18 and 26 degrees centigrade.
