

1. The Romanian General Inspectorate for Emergency Situations has provided the following updated information about the situation in the stricken area:

1.1 Due to the international assistance offered to Romania during last two months and to the stabilised weather from last week, national authorities decided that there is no need for further request of assistance. Romanian national and local intervention teams in close cooperation with the international intervention teams that are still operating in the stricken areas are capable to manage the post-disaster situation.
