

1. The situation in the flood stricken counties is still critical:

1.1 The worst flooding has occurred along the Siret River where water levels have risen twenty-fold in recent days. The worst affected, among 31 counties affected, are Harghita, Bacau, Galati, Vrancea and Braila counties in the eastern part of the country; these counties have been placed under alert status.

1.2 The death toll has risen to 21 people, almost 14,000 people have been evacuated. In total, 581 localities in 31 counties were affected, 13,856 houses have been flooded, 7,685 houses are damaged, 586 houses are destroyed, 16,561 outbuildings are affected, 4,614 wells are flooded, about 516 bridges of various sizes are damaged, 27 bridges are destroyed and 33 dams are damaged. A total area of 88,072 ha of agricultural land has been flooded, as well. Roads (some 1270 kilometres) and railroads are also flooded.

1.3 Romanian authorities continue to provide food, water and shelter to the evacuated population. Vaccinations against hepatitis type A and against typhoid are being administered. Efforts to drain water, remove animal corpses and pest control against insects are ongoing. Floods are receding; however, the situation is still critical as the evacuated population cannot return to their homes yet.

4. Assistance provided by EAPC Nations

The following assistance has been offered / provided to the stricken country:

4.1 Czech Republic

- 4.1.1 Power generator, 220/380 V, 24 to 60kVA set 9
- 4.1.2 Ration pack and hygiene kit for one person per one day kit 4.500
- 4.1.3 The assistance (material and transportation) is valued five million CZC, approximately EURO 166.000. The point of delivery is being negotiated bilaterally

4.2 Germany

4.2.1 Two experts from THW have been deployed to explore the possibilities of rapid humanitarian technical assistance.

4.3 Hungary

- 4.3.1 Search and rescue team with medical component, 13 team members, 2 trucks, 2 outboard engine boats team 1
- 4.3.2 Water purification unit, 8 personnel, 4 trucks, 3 trailers team 1
- 4.3.3 Tents pcs 6
- 4.3.4 Field kitchen set 1
- 4.3.5 Mud pump set 2
- 4.3.6 Sleeping bags, camp-beds, blankets set 20
- 4.3.7 Waterproof clothing pcs 20
- 4.3.8 Electrical generator, 5 kVA set 3
- 4.3.9 Solid disinfectant kg 870

4.3.10 The assistance has reached the Romanian border on 16 July 05 at 11:40 UTC. The water purification unit has departed from Budapest on 18 July 05 and will deploy to Targu-Ocna in Bacau county.
