

1. According to Romanian authorities floods in the north-eastern part of the country have caused damage worth 800 million dollars (670 million euros). The damage occurred during 10 days of torrential rains that drenched 42 regions. Most affected were the counties of Harghita, Bacau, Vrancea, Galati and Braila. Romanian authorities continue to provide food, water and shelter to the evacuated population. Efforts to drain floodwaters from houses and agricultural areas and to remove animal are ongoing.

The Romanian authorities wish to thank all nations that are providing flood relief assistance.

4.1.10 Relief goods for 3.000 people in the districts of Bacau and Vrancea are being distributed by Caritas Austria in close cooperation with the local administration starting 20 July 05. The goods are being purchased in Iasi with the help of Caritas Romania. Medical supplies have been shipped on 22 July 05 to Bacau.
