



1. Summary:

- 1.1 In January and February 2006 heavy snowfall caused severe damages in Southern Kyrgyzstan, namely in Osh and Jalalabat Provinces.
- 1.2 AUSTRIA, HUNGARY, ROMANIA, SLOVAK REPUBLIC, SPAIN, RUSSIAN FEDERATION and TURKEY informed the EADRCC, that assistance had been or could be provided. (For details, please see below.)
- 1.3 United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UN-OCHA) funded transportation of the donations from Austria and Hungary by truck. The truck arrived in Bishkek on 05 April 2006. The transportation was coordinated by the EADRCC.
- 1.4 Nations were invited to finance the transport of the remaining donations from Slovakia and Romania. Funding arrangement could have been made through the EADRCC.

Since there was no response to the request for funding, and no other resources were available, the transportation of offers from Romania and Slovak Republic were not possible.
- 1.5 The Ministry of Emergency Situations of the Kyrgyz Republic informed EADRCC that due to the international assistance provided the situation had stabilised.




