

1. The Bulgarian Authorities have provided the following situation updates:

The fire fighting efforts continue with all available resources from local and national fire services, Civil Protection and the Ministry of Defence being employed. **During last 24 hours, because of the dry weather and wind new fires originated.** The State of disaster is still ongoing in 4 municipalities of the country.

1.1. Because of the dry weather some regions suffer from drought. **Populated areas in the District of Targovishte, Silistra and Vratza are without water supply.** Water-carriers are provided by Civil protection.

2. The following international assistance had been requested:



3. **Points of Entry:** Airport Sofia, Airport Varna, Airport Burgas, Airport Krumovo

4. Assistance offered or provided by EAPC nations:

5. The Russian Federation, on a bilateral basis, provided one IL-76 fire fighting airplane, arriving on 21 July. The airplane performed 18 fire-fighting flights, dropping 756 tons of water. On 24 July, the aircraft completed its mission in Bulgaria and was relocated to another theatre.

5.1. The Republic of Turkey, on 21 July, offered a fire-fighting helicopter, which has been accepted by Bulgaria on 25 July. However, in the meantime the helicopter has been already sent to the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia¹



5.2. **Fifteen** EAPC countries have informed the EADRCC that, regrettably, they do not possess the requested capabilities or that the capabilities are not available at this moment.
