


1. Situation update:

- 1.1 According to local authorities the sea water level started to decrease slowly. However, due to earlier and some recent accidents the number of casualties reached 117.
- 1.2 Metro, tram and rail traffic are partly restored, although they haven't reached their full capacity yet. Roads, with the exclusion of several parts in coastal zones, are generally passable. The situation in hospitals is also returning to normal.
- 1.3 Helsinki harbour and other harbours in Western Uusimaa are still closed. Another 30 persons have been evacuated from the remote islets.
- 1.4 Despite several leakages of hazardous chemical substances there is no immediate danger for the population. Following LEMA recommendations OSOCC released safety precautions for the teams working in potentially contaminated areas.
- 1.5 According to the Finnish Meteorological Institute the thunderstorm is likely to be over, with no recurrence expected. The weather conditions will return to normal during next 2 days.

2. National response

- 2.1. Finnish civil protection resources supported by the military continue rescue and relief operations. Additional resources from inland provinces have arrived to Uusimaa to help local rescuers.

3. International response

3.1 International teams from 17 NATO and partner countries continue rescue and relief operations.

3.2 According to the agreement with the LEMA the international teams are deployed mainly to the most critical sites.

3.3 The Finnish authority requested through the EADRCC/CEP support from Planning Boards and Committees' (PB&Cs') Civil Experts. **Seven Civil Experts** from Food and Agriculture Planning Committee (FAPC) and Civil Protection Committee (CPC) **were contacted at their normal place of work and were asked for advice within their area of expertise.**

4. According to the Finnish Government **there is no need for additional international assistance.**

5. **On behalf of the Finnish Government the EADRCC wishes to thank EAPC nations for the assistance and support offered and provided.**
