

1. In accordance with the procedures at reference, EADRCC has invited nations to share information on national measures taken to prepare for the possibility of an influenza A(H1N1) pandemic.

### **2. General Situation**

2.1. The World Health Organization (WHO) is coordinating the global response to human cases of influenza A(H1N1) and monitoring the corresponding threat of an influenza pandemic. As of 07:30 GMT, 10 May 2009, 29 countries have officially reported 4379 cases of influenza A(H1N1) infection. Further and updated information is available on the WHO webpage at [www.who.int](http://www.who.int).

2.2. Mexico has reported 1626 laboratory confirmed human cases of infection, including 45 deaths. The United States has reported 2254 laboratory confirmed human cases, including two deaths. Canada has reported 280 laboratory confirmed human cases, including one death. Costa Rica has reported eight laboratory confirmed human cases, including one death.

The following countries have reported laboratory confirmed cases with no deaths - Argentina (1), Australia (1), Austria (1), Brazil (6), China, Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (1), Colombia (1), Denmark (1), El Salvador (2), France (12), Germany (11), Guatemala (1), Ireland (1), Israel (7), Italy (9), Japan (4), Netherlands (3), New Zealand (7), Panama (3), Poland (1), Portugal (1), Republic of Korea (3), Spain (93), Sweden (1), Switzerland (1) and the United Kingdom (39).

### **3. Summary of measures taken by nation**

3.1. The EADRCC has received information from 30 nations (Albania, Austria, Azerbaijan, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Kyrgyz Republic, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxemburg, Moldova, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Russia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine and United Kingdom).

3.2. From the information received it is clear that the health organizations in these countries are monitoring development of the situation on national and international levels. All necessary measures are taking within appropriate updated plans, which were adopted in 2005-2006 in response to the "Asian gripp".

3.3. Sufficient numbers of protective devices for healthcare providers designated for treatment of infectious diseases have been secured.
