Situation

1. Due to the situation in the Kyrgyz Republic, the interim government of the Kyrgyz Republic requested NATO Civil Emergency Planning (CEP) distribute requirements of medicines and medical equipment for use in emergencies to the Points of Contact. This list was issued on 10 April 2010 and updated on 15 April 2010.

2. The following International Organisations/nations have advised that they have provided bilateral support to the Kyrgyz Republic since SITREP 1 was issued:

2.1. 20 April: The U.S. Agency for International Development donated \$100,000 worth of medical supplies to help hospitals that are treating victims of the April 7-8 civil unrest in the Kyrgyz Republic. The donation was procured by USAID's grantee CitiHope International. The donation includes bandages, syringes, various surgical supplies, and other materials used for emergency treatment of patients. The medical supplies will be delivered to a total of 10 hospitals in Bishkek City as well as to Chui, Naryn, and Talas provinces. USAID is donating medical supplies at the request of Kyrgyz Republic's Ministry of Health and it is based on the needs of the local hospitals.

2.2. 22 April: The WHO reconfirmed the list of humanitarian aid provided by IOs. The information remains the same as reflected in our SITREP 1.

2.3. 23 April: The Emergency Management Department MIA of Georgia provided a list of medical supplies provided to the Kyrgyz Republic. See attachment.

2.4. 26 April: In continuation to previous communication regarding the NATO/CEP request to provide medical assistance to the Kyrgyz Republic, the Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs is pleased to confirm that emergency medical aid is being prepared and will leave Israel at the end of this week. The Israeli Ambassador to the Kyrgyz Republic (with

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residence in Kazakhstan) will be in touch with the relevant authorities to coordinate the transfer of the medical supplies. A completed list of the supplies will be forwarded in the coming days.

2.5. 26 April: Kazakhstan has notified us that they have decided to provide 3,000 tonne of diesel to the Kyrgyz Republic responding to their request for assistance.


