

1. Situation update:

1.1 The flood waves have traveled along the rivers up north causing additional flooding and will reach the Pomerania and West Pomerania provinces. Heavy rain caused rivers to burst their banks. People are being evacuated from the affected areas. Fifteen casualties have been reported and thousands were evacuated. All rescue services are involved in emergency operations. Most affected areas are in the surroundings of the cities of Tarnobrzeg, Sandomierz, Tarnow, and Plock. The emergency situation is monitored by the authorities and rescue forces are relocated downstream of the three main rivers Wistula, Warta and Oder.

2. **There is no pending request for assistance.**
