



1. Situation update:

1.1 Since the beginning of the disaster, 2000 sq/km have been flooded (0,8% of total Polish area).

1.2 As a consequences of flooding, 16 people died and 24300 people had to be evacuated from the most flooded areas.

2. There was a request for assistance for high capacity water pumps. The Polish Government conveys the gratitude and special thanks to the donor countries with regard to the assistance provided.

2.1. **There is no need for international assistance any more.**

3. International Assistance:

3.1 provided by EAPC Nations:

Ukraine – two flood rescue teams with necessary equipment.			
Team 1	Location - next to Sandomierz (Baranow Sandomierski, Mielec)		
	30 persons, 4 pumps, two 550m ³ /h, one 360m ³ /h, one 250 m ³ /h		
Team 2	location next to Tarnobrzeg (Dzikow) – accomplished the mission on 24.06.2010		
	40 persons, 8 pumps total capacity 880 m ³ /h		

3.2 Coordinated by the European Union Civil Protection Mechanism:
(based on the report received from the Monitoring and Information Centre)

3.2.1 Czech Republic (5 teams) and Holland accomplished their mission on 25.06.2010 in the morning, after that Mechanism was deactivated;

3.2.2 Germany (6 High capacity water pump teams with 5 water and 3 slurry pumps).

3.2.3 France (2 teams of 16 with 4 water pumps);

3.2.4 EU co-financed multinational High Capacity Pumping module/team Estonia/Latvia/Lithuania (composed of 19 people with 3 pumps);

3.2.5 Denmark (high capacity water pumping module of 8 people)

3.3 Poland accepted donations made by two countries (bilateral support)

3.3.1 USA - 13 slurry pumps;

3.3.2 Russia - 18 slurry pumps, 34 rescue boats and 5 mobile power generators
