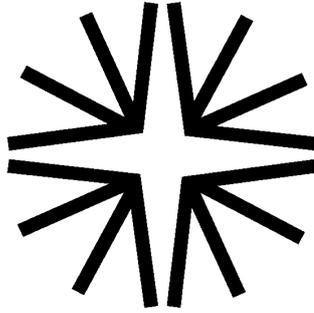

1. In accordance with the procedures at reference, EADRCC has received today, 06 June 2010, a disaster assistance request from Hungary. The following information was provided.

2. General Situation

Type of the Disaster : **Flood**
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : **15 May 2010**
Location of the Disaster : **Borsod-Abauj-Zemplen county, Northern Hungary**

3. Initial Assessment of the damage and description of the situation.

3.1. Defensive alert is being maintained on the length of 3056km of the Hungarian rivers. Level I on the length of 1078kms, level II on the length of 610kms, level III on the length of 1138kms and emergency alert on the length of 230kms.

3.2. The Danube is flooding on its whole Hungarian length. The peak of the flood in Budapest is due to happen on Monday. On the whole length of the Ipoly the water level is measured over the Highest Water Level. In the early morning today the flood on the Tisza has peaked at Tiszabecs at Level III. The flood on the Hernad is expected to peak at the previously forecast level but at least half a day later. The flood on the Bódva has been being long close to its peak. All tributaries of the Bodrog are flooding, at its peak the water

level is expected to exceed Level III for a stretched period. On the Zagyva defensive alert level III is being maintained and the water has started slowly ebbing away.

3.3. Defensive actions have been carried out in 12 of the 19 countries, in 259 towns by 21.490 persons. 3090 persons have been evacuated.

4. National resources available for disaster response and measures taken.

4.1. All national resources are heavily involved in dealing with consequences of the disaster.
