

1. Situation update:

1.1 The flood situation is still critical in the southern part of the Republic of Moldova. The water level is increasing slowly, but constantly.

1.2 As a consequence of flooding, 2 persons died, more than 3 500 persons have been evacuated. About 610 houses have been flooded, about 200 houses are destroyed and about 150 houses are still at the risk of flooding.

1.3 The pumping works carried out in the regions of Nisporeni – Grozesti – Barboieni; Hincesti – Nemteni – Cotul Morii – Obileni – Sarateni; Ungheni – Macaresti.

1.4 Building protection actions and fortification of dams have been carried out in the regions: Leova – Tochile-Raducani, Hanasenii Noii, Razesti; Cantemir – Ghioltosu, Gotesti, Tiganca, Sttoianovca, Leca, Toceni, Antonesti; Cahul – Cislita Prut, Valeni, Brinza, Colobas, Slobozia Mare, Giurgiulesti.

2. The following requirements for international assistance have been identified:

2.2	Boats for shallow water with transport capacity for about 5-10 persons	ASAP	10

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3. Assistance provided/offered by EAPC Nations:

3.1 **Georgia** offered to send the Rescue team (23 persons) with 3 water pumps and 3000 litres of drinking water. This offer was not accepted by Moldovan authorities.

3.2 On 19th of July the Federal State Hesse (**Germany**) delivered to Chisinau 30 000 sandbags (60x30cm).

3.3 The Embassy of **Germany** in Romania has provided Moldovan Civil Protection Emergency Situation Service (CPESS) with life vests, trousers and rubber boots. The EU CP team facilitated the hand over to the CPESS of that assistance.

3.4 The EADRCC has been informed that the Government of the State of **Israel** donated 1000 blankets and 13 tents. The donation value is 20.000 EUR.

3.5 The **Unites States of America** will provide \$50,000 to the International Federation of the Red Cross to provide emergency relief supplies in Moldova due to the serious flooding.

3.6 The following assistances have been provided to Moldova through EU – Civil Protection Mechanism:

– **Austria:**


- 31.000 sand bags (PP/ polypropylene, dimension 40 x 70 cm) packed on 4 EURO pallets LxWxH = 1.200x800x1.200 mm, weight: 1.200kg;
- 3.840 m² PE plastic sheets/tarpaulins containing of 96 pieces each 10x4 m, thickness 0,2 mm packed on 2 EURO pallets LxWxH = 1.200x800x1.200 mm, weight: 590 kg.

– **Romania:**

- 20 kits of well cleaning systems;
- 10 inflatable boats with 26 rescuers;
- 30 000 sandbags;
- 15 000 m² polyethylene film;
- 20 tons of bottled mineral water;
- 1 water purification unit.
