

**1. Situation update:**

1.1 Flood water continue towards the South of Pakistan devastating now Sindh Province. Heavy rains continue in the North of Pakistan. Weather forecast indicate that rain will likely continue to fall over Sidh and other parts of the country over the coming days.

1.2 According to the latest National Disaster Management Authorities (NDMA) figures more than 1200 people died (19 people have died during the last 24 hours), 14 million people are affected of whom 1.8 million are homeless, over 300 000 houses are thought to be damaged or destroyed across the affected provinces.

**2. The following requirements for international assistance have been identified:**

2.1 According to the UN OCHA shelter is the most urgent need, while food, water and health care are also crucial.

### 3. International assistance:

3.1 The following nations offered/provided assistance:

3.1.1 **Austria** has offered 96 boxes of NaDCC water purification tablets (960.000 tablets good to purify around 4,800.000 litres of turbid water) (through EC Civil Protection Mechanism)

3.1.2 **Azerbaijan** will provide 1 million USD to Pakistan for overcoming consequences of the flood and to support suffering population.

3.1.3 **Italy** (Fire Fighting and Rescue Services and Civil Defence Department) is considering sending tents and beds.

3.1.4 **Slovakia** is considering possibility to provide humanitarian and financial assistance.

3.2 Several countries are providing bilateral assistance namely: Belgium, Canada, Estonia, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Norway, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, The Netherlands, Turkey, United Kingdom and United States (for details see the attached table).

### 4. Response co-ordination.

With a view to providing a coordinated response to the stricken nation's requirements, nations in a position to meet these demands, in full or in part, are invited to reply to the Operational Point of Contact of the Stricken Nation, with an information copy to EADRCC, by any of the communication means listed above and below.

<b>BELGIUM</b>	€ 500.000 to UN Agencies for relief activities in favour of flood-affected populations.

<b>ESTONIA</b>	€ 64.000 to WFP	
<b>FRANCE</b>	Announced a contribution of € 300.000 to be allocated to three NGO's working in the region.
