

**1. Situation update:**

1.1 Due to continuous rainfall since mid-November 2010, water levels in the lakes and on the rivers have been rising. As a result 12 Montenegrin municipalities (out of 21) have been continuously flooded.

1.2 All lines of communication from the capital to the North of the country are cut off.

1.3 The water level is slowly decreasing in the Skadar Lake and in the accumulation lakes around Nikšići (Slano, Krupac and Vrtać). According to the national authority report as of 11 December 2010, the number of affected families stands at 2,000, out of which 1,680 have been evacuated. Civil protection units continue to provide food, water and water transport to the people who are trapped in their houses or to those who would like to check their property situation.

1.4 Activities on strengthening the embankment, draining the water from the objects, cleaning the roads, as well as assisting the endangered population that has been affected are still ongoing.

1.5 In the middle region of the country - in the city districts of Golubovci and Tuzi the level of the Skadar Lake is decreasing. The roadway Podgorica-Bar is closed for traffic for all motor vehicles, while the traffic is cut off toward the Republic of Albania at the border crossing in Bozaj and Sukobin.

1.6 On the southern part of the country - The level of river Bojana is in slight decrease. The works on strengthening the protective embankment at the river Bojana are ongoing so that the protecting dam could completely fulfill its function.

1.7 On the northern part of the country – The level of the river Lim and smaller rivers is decreasing. Activities on strengthening the embankment, draining the water from the objects, cleaning the roads, as well as assisting the endangered population that has been affected are still ongoing. From the total number of evacuated persons (1084) in Berane, in collective accommodations are still 161 persons.

## 2. Measures taken by Montenegrin authorities.

- 2.1. The rescue operations and evacuation have been carried out by the Montenegrin Armed Forces, the Police Directorate and the Civilian Rescue Agency. The operations have been carried out by the Ministry of Interior.
- 2.2. The affected population is constantly helped by supplying food, water, hygienic means and forage. The evacuation of population, livestock and properties, and the provision of health care are still continuing.


## 3. The following requirements for international assistance have been identified:

## 4. Assistance provided/offered by EAPC and MD Nations:

- 4.1. **Austria** has offered the following assistance with *total value of 60.000 euro* (accepted by Montenegro):
  - 5 petrol driven power generators RS14 (14kVA) dimensions: 85/45/58 each generator.
  - 6 petrol driven mud water pumps "Wacker" (capacity: 1.300 l/min) dimensions: 68/51/57 each pump.
- 4.2. **Belgium** has offered 10 pumps +/- 72m<sup>3</sup>/h, For every pump: 3 suction pipes + stainer + 1 or 2 discharge pipes (20 meters). The diameter of the pipes: 70mm or 110mm according to the type of the pump. Every pump weighs +/- 75kg.
- 4.3. **Czech Republic** sent 12 power generators, 550 sleeping bags, 4 boats with pumps, 3 tents and 25 hand pumps.



- 4.4. **Greece** has sent one C-130 aircraft with 2000 sand bags, 8 tents, 500 blankets, 50 portable beds, First aid kits.
- 4.5. *A shipment from **Israel** of 257 family tents (4 persons) will be sent directly, as soon as possible to Montenegro.*
- 4.6. **Italy** has granted the following contribution with total value of 149.984,16 euros, 196.314,35 US dollars:
- 4000 (50% wool 50% synthetic fibers) blankets with value in euros of 12.682,40 in US dollars 16.600,00;
  - 2 inflatable boats, w/eng & access & safety jackets (4 crtn boxes) with value in euros of 23.913,20, in US dollars 31.300,00;
  - 10 plastic rolls with value in euros of 2.190,08, in US dollars 2.866,60;
  - 504 family type kitchen sets with value in euros of 17.573,96, in US dollars 23.002,56;
  - 5 diesel generators, (5 Kva), with lamp, with value in euros of 21.309,03, in US dollars 27.891,40;
  - 3 diesel generators (10 Kva), wheel-mount, for a value in euros of 5.742,03 in US dollars 26.604,75;
  - 2 diesel generators (18 Kva), with lamp, with value in euros of 11.589,76 in US dollars 15.169,84;
  - 120 multipurpose tents, 25 sq.m. with value in euros of 44.983,71, in US dollars 58.879,20.
- 4.7. **Poland** has offered 1 rescue team of 20 persons, 22 pumps (6 pumps 666 l/min, 6 pumps 1200 l/min, 10 pumps 1800 l/min) with own logistics (tents, food).
- 4.8. **Slovak Republic** has contributed the following assistance (total amount – 123.700 euro):
- 5 pc Power station 4 KWA ;
  - 2 pc Power station HONDA 4500;
  - 5 pc Lighting set;
  - 4800 pc Raincoat;
  - 3 pc Pallette EURO;
  - 5 pc Pallette;
  - 30 pc Pallette metal.
- 4.7. **Slovenia** has provided the following items:
- 10.000 pcs of sandbags (55x110 cm)
  - 100 pcs of rubber boots
  - 5 pcs of mobile generators
- 4.9. **Turkey** has offered 1000 blankets, 800 food packages, 150 tents and medicines.

**5. Points of Entry:**

- 5.1. Air – the International airport Golubovci in Podgorica.
- 5.2. Sea – the Port of Bar.
- 5.3. By road – Border crossing between Montenegro and Croatia – Debeli Brijeg, Border crossing between Montenegro and Bosnia and Herzegovina – Vracenovici.
