

1. In accordance with the procedures at reference, NATO has received on 14 September 2011, a request for assistance from **PAKISTAN** (through the Embassy of Pakistan in Belgium). On 15 September, the North Atlantic Council (NAC) authorized activation of the EADRCC. **This revised Request for Assistance reflects the detailed requirements received from Pakistan Authorities today.**

The following information has been provided by Pakistan:

2. General Situation

Type of the Disaster : **Monsoon floods**
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : **12 September 2011**
Location of the Disaster : **Pakistan**

3. Initial assessment of the damage and description of the situation.

3.1. Hundreds of people have lost their lives and over five million people have been displaced and directly affected by the floods. Nearly 301,000 individuals are currently living in 2,150 relief sites. The number of death is 226 (59 women and 34 children) according to UN OCHA.

3.2. Over four million acres of land is under water; 2.5 million acres of crops have been destroyed; and over a million houses have been damaged or washed away.

3.3. The situation is deteriorating with forecast of more widespread rains in the area.

3.4. According to SHAPE METOC, the monsoon rains should end around Sunday easing the situation. Normally, they end around the beginning of September. Thus, areas of Panjab and Sindh have received 200-300 cm of rain this month with some areas up to 700 cm.
