

1. Situation update:

1.1 Monsoonal rains ceased as projected last week. Most flooding is limited to lower Sindh province. The rains moved well to the East into central/southern India, reducing the potential for additional widespread heavy rainfall and flooding in Pakistan. Isolated showers are expected to occur over the northern-most extend of Pakistan due to the remains of a weak through exiting the region. Sindh province is expected to remain dry for the week.

1.2 The joint UN / Government assessment through the Clusters has been completed in 16 districts of Sindh. The shelter cluster rapid assessment indicates a significant need for shelter, kitchen sets and blankets. There is a need to chlorinate the water in all the affected district of Sindh.

1.3 On 18 September, the UN launched a rapid response plan for Pakistan, US\$ 357 million. On 16 September, the European Commission announced 10 million euro in emergency relief for the victims of the floods.

1.4 The number of people affected by the monsoon rains reaches at least 5.4 million with 1.8 million displaced.

1.5 The number of deaths has reached to 347 in the past six weeks, according to the NDMA report.

2. The following requirements for international assistance have been identified:

2.1. Family tents (both normal as well as winterized); 2.2. Water purification tablets / aqua tab; 2.3. Water purification equipment (preferably family straw); 2.4. High energy biscuits; 2.5. Medicines; 2.6. Blankets; 2.7. Plastic sheets; 2.8. Mosquito nets (preferably LLIN); 2.9. Hygiene kits, as per sphere standard, as per following specifications: a) 10 liters water container for storage: one per household; b) 250 g bathing soap: per person per month; c) 200 g laundry soap: per person per month; d) Tooth paste 75 ml/100g - 01 No. per person per month; e) Tooth brush - 01 No. per person per month.

3. Assistance provided through EU-Mechanism:

3.1. Austria offered assistance consisting of 3,010,000 “Aquatabs 167 mg” water purification tablets (each tablet to purify appr. 20 litres of water) and 300 winterized family tents (4x4 m UNHCR Specifications – good for a 5/6 persons family). The offer has been accepted by Pakistani Authorities.

3.2. France has offered jerry cans, water tanks, kitchen utensils and 1.2 tonnes of pharmaceuticals.

4. Assistance provided by EAPC Nations:

4.1. Slovak Republic offered humanitarian aid consisting of 5 tents, 1000 blankets, 98 jerry cans of petrol.

5. The United States Agency of International Development has contributed \$100,000 for non food items, water, sanitation, and hygiene activities (WASH) – specifically plastic sheets, rope, Aquatabs and jerry cans on bilateral basis.

6. Norway is supporting the Red Cross and other relief organisations with 5.2 million Euro.
