

1. General Situation.

Type of the Disaster : Massive Snowfalls  
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : beginning of 2012  
Location of the Disaster : Northeast and Southeast of Albania


1.1. The weather situation is improving and higher temperatures have predominated. Minimal temperatures have risen by a moderate 2 degrees and the snow is gradually melting.

1.2. Regional collecting centres of state reserves in Kukws, Puka and Dibra were supplied with food, blankets and other means.

1.3. Presently **7 communes** are still isolated (Shkodra Qark – 4 and Qark of Kukës – 3). **In Qark of Elbasan, district of Librazhd and district of Gramsh there are 6 villages isolated and few more villages in districts of Bulqiza and Mirdita. All the communes are taking appropriate measures to access the internal rural roads and villages.**

1.4. The weather conditions enabled the opening of many schools and educational institutions. In the region of Puka, which was one of the most affected areas, all educational institutions are open and apart of a few in Tropoja, Dukagjin, and Librazhd Region the rest of them are open. Many private enterprises are back in business.

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2. National resources available for disaster response and measures taken.

2.1. National, regional and communal emergency headquarters of Civil Emergencies have been set up and have intensified their activity due to harsh weather conditions. Fire and rescue service, emergency medical teams, police and special forces, helicopter units, regional support brigades and army are engaged in rescue, evacuation and other emergency activities.

**2.2. Army helicopter wing has not conducted any missions on 22 February 2012.**

**2.3. Dumpers, graders, and retrofitted trucks have worked on opening the blocked motorways. So far Qafë Mali – Qafë Shllak (reports for high risk on avalanches as the snow thickness reaches up to 3.5 m) and Qafë Mali – Fierzë are the only national axes blocked in Qark of Shkoder. In Qark of Kukes only Pac – Qaf Luzhë is blocked.**
