

1. In accordance with the procedures at reference, EADRCC has received on, 06 September 2012, a request for assistance from Jordan dated 06 September 2012 13:08 UTC. The following information was provided.

2. General Situation

Type of the Disaster : **Flow of Syrian refugees into Jordan**
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : **During the last months**
Location of the Disaster : **Jordan side of the Syrian border**

3. Initial Assessment of the situation.


3.1. According to UNHCR, the number of Syrian refugees in Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon and Turkey could increase from the current figure of more than 300.000 to a total of 710.000 people by the end of this year.

3.2. Jordan hosts the largest Syrian refugee community. The number of registered and assisted refugees in Jordan is 101.881, which is app. One third of the total number of refugees in the region.

3.3. In Jordan, refugees continue to arrive at a rate of more than 1,000 a day. Some **35,000** people arrived in September, **16,000** more as compared with the previous month. More than **30,000** people have been received at the Za'atri camp since it opened on July 30.

3.4. Due to the considerable increase in number of refugees, the Jordan authorities have decided to accept offers by the international community to share the burden.

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4. The following requirements for international assistance have been identified and updated as shown in the pages at the end of this message:

5. Assistance provided by EAPC nations and international organisations:

5.1. Austria has sent 20 tent heaters, 2000 blankets to Jordan Za`atri camp through EU Civil Protection Mechanism. Additionally assistance with 1.000 kitchen sets and 1.000 Hygiene kits is expecting to be delivered on 15 October 2012.

5.2. On 27 September 2012 the Slovak Republic sent Humanitarian Aid through EU Civil Protection Mechanism to Jordan by air. Below mentioned list of assistance was delivered:

- 5.000 Dining containers;
- 10.000 Plastic spoons ;
- 8.000 Plastic plates;
- 10.000 Plastic cups;
- 19 Field toilets;
- 1 Field plastic washroom;
- 8 Field small outdoor washrooms;
- 100 Blankets;
- Totally 196 Thermos food or drink containers - 144 (5 liters), 36 (12 liters) and 16 (25 liters);

Total value is 70.000 EUROS.

5.3. On 3 October 2012 Norway shipped 5.000 blankets to Jordan through EU Civil Protection Mechanism.

6. Points of Entry / Delivery:

- 6.1. Queen Alia International Airport, for commercial cargo.
- 6.2. Marka Airport, for Charter flights.

8. Response co-ordination.

8.1. UN OCHA and the Regional Humanitarian Coordinator remain in the lead of the overall coordination of the response to the Syria crisis. For the coordination of the response to refugees, UNHCR has appointed a Regional Refugee Coordinator.



8.2. With a view to providing a coordinated response to the stricken nation's requirements, nations in a position to meet these demands, in full or in part, are invited to coordinate closely with UN OCHA and UNHCR and to reply to the Ministry of Planning of Jordan with an information copy to EADRCC, by any of the communication means listed above and below.


