

ICI MENU OF PRACTICAL ACTIVITIES FOR 2006

INTRODUCTION

1. The Istanbul Cooperation Initiative was launched at the Istanbul Summit by Allies Heads of State and Government. This Initiative would essentially be achieved through practical cooperation in the agreed priority areas and illustrative menu of specific activities.

2. Following the successful round of consultations with interested countries of the region and the decision regarding the membership of several interested countries, NATO has developed a menu of practical activities in the agreed priority areas which will serve as a basis to develop and execute agreed work plans with each interested ICI country. Following the accession of Bahrain, Kuwait, Qatar and the UAE to the ICI, the Menu of Practical Activities for 2005 was transmitted to those countries and experts' teams visited the four countries to discuss practical cooperation with them.

3. This year's menu of practical activities is composed of three different sections: an introduction, a description of the 12 areas of cooperation and the list of activities in each area of cooperation. This menu will gradually be expanded in line with the progressive nature of this Initiative. This year, the emphasis has been set on activities which will enable representatives and officers from ICI countries to increase their understanding about NATO and its activities. The present menu of activities should be considered as a living document which can be subject to further changes or the addition of new activities. Further details will be communicated to ICI countries by the relevant NATO Points of Contact (POC) which are clearly identified for each activity.

4. The present menu of activities has been sorted into different areas of cooperation in order to make practical information such as venues, attendance, points of contact, clearly identifiable.

5. ICI countries are reminded that the present menu of practical activities constitutes an invitation in itself. In this regard, these countries should not wait for official invitations to be sent for each specific activity. **ICI countries are therefore invited to select activities in the present menu and send a consolidated list** to Gilles Vander Ghinst (RAMD/PASP tel: +32 2 707 49 89 - fax: 32 2 707 52 28 - e-mail: g.vanderghinst@hq.nato.int). This list will form the **basis of the individual work plans**.

6. Participation in all NATO activities listed is completely on a self-funding basis.

7. NATO will develop the necessary liaison arrangements including the nomination of Contact Point Embassies to facilitate the participation of ICI countries in the activities listed in the present document. For most activities taking place in Europe or in North America, a visa will be required for which NATO will not be

responsible. However, letters of invitation can be sent by NATO relevant Point of Contacts to facilitate the deliverance of such visas.

8. An agreement on the protection of classified information, so called "security agreement", might be required in the future for a limited number of activities. NATO will develop such agreement with interested ICI countries. The NATO Office of Security will brief representatives of interested ICI countries on the modalities and the procedures for concluding such an agreement. However, none of the activities listed in the present document require such an agreement.
