






Security Incidents




Attacks conducted by insurgent networks in Afghanistan are mainly in the South and East, but there are also some networks in the North and West.



Security Incidents included are attacks against ISAF and Afghan Security Forces from January – October 2009.








Afghanistan National Security Forces Growth Plan


