## **DETAILED INSTRUCTION TO THE QUESTIONNAIRE**

#### **NOTES FOR COMPLETION:**

- All data and figures used in your 2016 National Report should reflect the situation on 31 December 2016.
- The integration of gender perspectives reflected in this questionnaire draws from and implements the requests of UNSCR 1325, Related Resolutions and directives emanating from NATO.
- Once you answered all the required questions, please submit the form using the "Submit" button that appears at the end of the last page.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Please read the following instructions carefully before start working on the questionnaire.

# 1. Possibility for more people to fill in the questionnaire at different times

The first step is to enter the online questionnaire form and create a profile by providing the name of the country, e-mail address of the person responsible for the final submission of the questionnaire. The questionnaire can be submitted even if it is partially filled. Once submitted, an e-mail containing the link of the questionnaire will be sent to the e-mail address provided at the log in. This link can be used to re-access the questionnaire page and modify it, or add data, for an unlimited number of times until the deadline for the submission of the Report. The link will open the questionnaire. This link can be shared among all personnel involved in the collection of the data and statistics for the questionnaire. This way, more people at once can access, modify and add data to the questionnaire.

# 2. Responsibility for the final submission

The responsible person for the final submission is the originator of the form whose e-mail address is on the questionnaire.

## 3. Correcting mistakes during the completion of the questionnaire

The link received via e-mail, the first time the questionnaire was submitted, can be used to access the questionnaire and modify possible mistakes. If statistics, data and information are changed after the deadline for the submission of the questionnaire, the responsible person for filling the questionnaire must contact the IMS-GENAD Office to communicate the changes. Modifications made after the deadline and not properly communicated may not be taken into consideration, because data will be processed immediately after the final submission.

## 4. Filling the tables: male and female active duty, reserves, and operations

The questions must be read carefully. When the question asks for numbers, provide the correct number. When the question asks for percentage, provide the correct percentage. It is recommended to double check the calculations. The category "Other" include all personnel that are not serving in the Army, Air Force or Navy.

The questionnaire must be completed in English.
