
Information

How to reach the nh WIEN Hotel, nh ATTERSEEHAUS Hotel and National Defence College

The workshop will take place at the National Defence College (Landesverteidigungsakademie) in Vienna, Austria on the 9th–11th of May 2006. The National Defence College is situated in the 7th District of Vienna called “Neubau” in the centre of the business and government district and cultural area of Vienna. The address is: Landesverteidigungsakademie, Stiftgasse 2A, 1070 WIEN.

Participants who will arrive on Monday 08th may 2006 will be picked up from the airport. Participants who arrive earlier or later will take the ÖBB Bus from the Airport direct to the WIEN WESTBAHNHOF. The costs are 8 EURO per drive. From the WIEN WESTBAHNHOF (Train Station) the Subway number 3 (U3 - orange coloured) goes two Stations in direction SIMMERING until the station NEUBAUGASSE. You take exit “STIFTGASSE”. On the upper side of the escalator you do not go on the “MARIAHILFERSTRASSE” because the Entrance of the nh wien Hotel is opposite between the NORDSEE Restaurant and the WEIN&Co Shop within the Subwaystation NEUBAUGASSE.

Participants who are located in the nh Atterseehaus leave the U3 at Station “Zieglergasse”. The hotel is opposite the Mc Donalds Restaurant.



Entrance , Registration

The registration is at the Entrance of the National Defence College. Participants have to take their passport or another ID Card with them because there will be a list of participants at the guard. The guard is ordered that entrance to the College is only allowed for people who are registered in the participation list of the NATO CCMS workshop.



Refund for EAPC Countries

For participants from the applicable EAPC countries the costs for the hotel and meals (apart from the free meals during the workshop) from Monday afternoon May 8th until Friday morning May 12th and the costs of transportation to Vienna will be refunded during the icebreaker or the coffee breaks on Tuesday and Wednesday on presentation of the relevant bills and tickets.

Security classification

All sessions of the meeting will be unclassified.

Language

English is the official language spoken during the meeting. Translation will not be provided.

Dress

Military Persons are invited to wear uniform during the official dinner but not on the registration and during the Icebreaker. For the Field Trip participants should plan walking shoes and rain coats (in case of bad weather). Usually it is warm in May in Vienna (about 20–25° Celsius) but it could also be raining a lot.
