Microbiological Safety of Drinking Water

Since August 2007 scientists from France, the Kyrgyz Republic and Uzbekistan have worked on a project to ensure the microbiological safety of drinking water in the latter two countries. A safe drinking water supply is an key priority in the Central Asian Republics, and this project aims to establish a standardized microbiological monitoring system in the region, based on international ISO/WHO standards. Two national laboratories will receive equipment and training.
