



NATO-Russia: forging a new relationship

NATO and Russia made a joint commitment to build a lasting and inclusive peace in the Euro-Atlantic area in the 1997 Founding Act on Mutual Relations, Cooperation and Security. This led to regular consultations and a substantial programme of cooperation, while, in the Balkans, Russian and NATO peacekeepers worked alongside each other from 1996 to 2003. In 2002, the relationship was given new impetus and substance with the creation of a new NATO-Russia Council, which brings together the individual Allies and Russia as equal partners to pursue opportunities for cooperation and joint action in areas of common interest and against new security threats.

NATO Information Office in Moscow

The NATO Information Office was established in Moscow in 2001 to improve knowledge and understanding between NATO and Russia, and to raise awareness of the activities of the NATO-Russia Council. The Office provides information, research assistance and project support to Russian citizens and organisations on NATO and security-related topics as well as access to NATO documents and publications. In cooperation with Russian partners, the Office is supporting the establishment of International Security Centres in the Russian Federation as NATO Contact Points.
