Methodology

Coverage 30 NATO Allies: general population aged 18+

Sample size n=1000 in each country, except n=500 Montenegro, Albania and North Macedonia

28,517 interviews were conducted in total

Methodology Online interviews, quotas applied on gender, age and region.

In Montenegro, Albania and North Macedonia, interviews were conducted via telephone.

All data has been weighted according to the latest population statistics.

Results for the NATO total take into account population size of each country.

Fieldwork period 5th November – 23rd November 2020


Margin of error The survey uses non-probability sampling. The <u>indicative</u> margin of error of +/- 3%.

Executive Summary

- The transatlantic bond continues to rate as highly important in dealing with security challenges (79% consider the relationship between North America and Europe important, compared to 81% in 2019).
- **Collective defence** receives strong support across the Alliance. 69% agree their country should defend another country if attacked; 76% agree other NATO countries should defend their country if attacked; and 58% agree NATO membership deters foreign attack.
- **Voting intention** remains high. In a referendum, 62% of Allies would vote for their nation to remain a NATO member. Only 11% would vote against membership.
- **Familiarity** with the organisation is stable and high: 81% know NATO at least a little, compared to 79% in 2019. 48% know NATO very well or a fair amount.
- **Defence spending:** 70% support maintained or increased defence spending, as in 2019.


79% of Allied citizens consider the transatlantic bond important for security

Q: How important do you consider the relationship between North America and Europe in dealing with security challenges today?




Support for the transatlantic bond by nation


Q: How important do you consider the relationship between North America and Europe in dealing with security challenges today?



A large majority of Allied citizens agree that their nation should defend other NATO nations if attacked


Q: To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? My country should defend another NATO country if attacked






76% of Allied citizens agree Allies should defend their nation if attacked


Q: To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? Other NATO countries should defend my country if attacked



58% of Allied citizens agree NATO membership is a deterrent to foreign attack; only 16% disagree


Q: To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? Our membership in NATO makes it less likely that a foreign nation will attack my country






62% of Allied citizens would vote for their nation to remain a NATO member in a referendum. Only 11% would vote to leave.


Q: If you could vote for or against your country's membership in NATO, how would you vote?








Allied citizens feel less safe than in 2019


Spread of contagious disease and economic crisis are principal concerns for Allied citizens

80% of Allied citizens know NATO at least a little


Q: Overall, how well would you say you know NATO?






Familiarity with NATO by nation


Q: Overall, how well would you say you know NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organisation)?




70% of citizens think their nation should maintain or increase defence spending

Q: Which of the following best reflects your view on your nation's defence spending?






Country should spend less on defence
