Methodology

Coverage 30 NATO Allies: general population aged 18+.

Sample size In each country 1,000 interviews were carried out, except in Montenegro, Albania and North Macedonia, where 500 interviews

were carried out per nation.

28,909 interviews were conducted in total.

Trend data is based on 29,101 interviews Apr/ May 2021, 28,517 interviews in 2020 and 28,752 interviews in 2019.

Methodology Online interviews, quotas applied on gender, age and region.

In Montenegro, Albania and North Macedonia, interviews were conducted via telephone. All data has been weighted

according to the latest population statistics. Total data are calculated based on population distribution.

Fieldwork period 12 November – 2 December 2021.

Margin of error The survey uses non-probability sampling. Indicative margin of error is +/- 3%.


All data is displayed in percentages unless otherwise specified. Due to rounding results will not always add up to 100%. The calculated totals may deviate by +/-1 pp from the sum of individual answer options due to rounding of the weighted data.

Executive Summary

- The transatlantic bond remains highly important in dealing with security challenges (81% consider the relationship between North America and Europe important, compared to 79% in 2020 and 81% in 2019).
- Collective defence receives majority support across the Alliance. 64% agree their country should defend another Ally
 if attacked. Only 9% disagree.
- **Voting intention** remains high. As in 2020, in a referendum, 62% of Allied citizens would vote for their nation to remain a NATO member. Only 11% would vote against membership.
- **Familiarity** with the organization overall is high: 74% know NATO at least a little, compared to 79% in 2019. 42% know NATO very well or a fair amount.
- **Defence spending:** 70% support maintained or increased defence spending, as in 2020 and 2019.
- Climate change is considered an issue which affects national security by a majority (57%), and 56% of Allied citizens think national militaries should reduce greenhouse gas emissions to a minimum to become carbon neutral in the future.
- **Russia** is viewed unfavourably by 46% of Allied citizens, compared to 43% in 2020. As in 2020, 18% have a favourable opinion. **China** is viewed unfavourably by 44% of of Allied citizens, compared to 39% in 2020.


A consistent majority of Allied citizens consider the transatlantic bond important for security (81%)

64% agree their country should defend another NATO country if attacked


Q: To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? (10-point response scale) (COUNTRY) should defend another NATO country if attacked.



71% agree their country should be defended by other NATO countries if attacked


Q: To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? (10-point response scale) Other NATO countries should defend (COUNTRY) if attacked.






53% agree NATO membership makes foreign attack less likely


62% of Allied citizens would vote for their country to remain a NATO member in a referendum; 11% would vote to leave

Q: If you could vote for or against your country's membership in NATO, how would you vote?




53% of Allied citizens feel safe in their country


Cost of living becomes the chief concern among Allied citizens (42%), followed by climate change (37%) and economic/financial crisis (35%)

Q: Which of the following are of greatest concern to you?




42% of Allied citizens say they know NATO very well or a fair amount

Q: Overall, how well would you say you know the following organisations? NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organization)




Familiarity with NATO by nation

Q: Overall, how well would you say you know the following organisations? NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organization)




70% of Allied citizens think their country should maintain or increase its defence spending

Q: Which of the following best reflects your view on your nation's defence spending?




59% of Allied citizens think it is important for countries to work together on shared objectives


58% of Allied citizens perceive climate change as a security issue

Q: How much, if at all, do you consider climate change an issue that affects (COUNTRY)'s national security?




56% of Allied citizens think national military should adhere to emissions targets

Q: Thinking about climate change and national security, which of the following statements best describes your view?





18% of Allied citizens have a favourable opinion of Russia, while 46% have an unfavourable opinion


Q: How would you describe your opinion of Russia?
