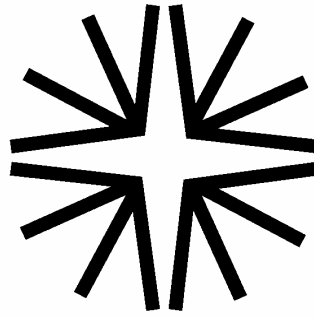

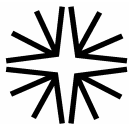
1. According to Bulgarian authorities the situation remains serious. The authorities have provided video footage of the floods in the Rousse area along the Iskar river, which has been posted on the NATO website. 1.1 National response teams continue with drainage works. Disinfecting activities in the affected areas continue. Evacuated people are given shelter and food.

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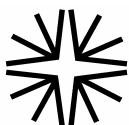

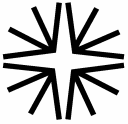
