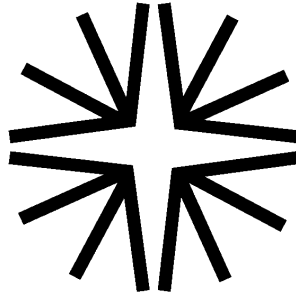

1. The EADRCC received the following report from the Emergency Situations and Civil Safety Service, MIA of Georgia 03.05.05 at 13:40:

"In disaster regions situation is stabilised, but forecast is still unreliable. Danger of flood, mudslide and landslide retains, due to heavy rain, which is still in progress. Water level is rising to dangerous high. Crisis management staffs, established on the spot, control the situation totally, especially are engaged regarding communication and restoring works. They are organising dissemination of government resources and humanitarian assistance in regions. Heavy-duty technique is mobilised for restoring works. Disaster has been enlarged in time, government resources will be finished by 4 May. Condition is still heavy because of danger of disaster offensive.

**Now local people are in need of food products, water, fuel requisitions."**
