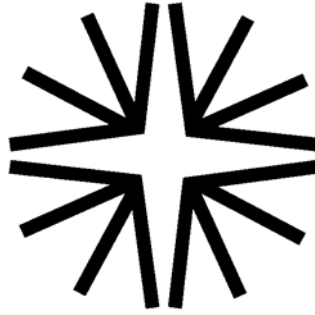

### 1. Situation update:

The situation in north-eastern Pakistan remains very serious. In the next three to four days severe weather with heavy rain is forecasted in the general area. It is also estimated that there is a three-week window of opportunity to deliver assistance to the mountainous areas before the first snowfall. On 23 October 05 new aftershocks measuring 5.9 on the Richter scale hit northern Pakistan in Mansehra town where the majority of survivors have found refuge from destroyed towns and villages of the Kashmiri mountains.

Out of three million homeless, 800.000 people are believed to be sleeping in the open. According to UN estimates, 75.000 people need urgent medical attention. The worst hit areas north east of Muzaffarabad remain inaccessible with at least 50.000 people there including untreated injured.

There is an urgent requirement for helicopters, winterised tents (up to 210.000 additional), blankets/sleeping bags (est. 2 million), water and sanitation (especially latrines), food assistance (for 1 million people) water bladders for affected hospitals, generators and diesel, tarpaulins, ground sheets, stoves, kitchen sets, **shovels ploughs, snow chains, antifreeze** and urgent medical assistance.

Ten B-747 (or similar) flights are available to reinforce the NATO air-bridge from Turkey starting Tuesday, 25 October 05. **Up to date NATO has organised or operated nineteen 23 relief flights to Pakistan with 295 tones of assistance. On 25 October, one DC-10 flight is scheduled to leave Ramstein with 30 tons of German relief items, and four**

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**C-130 flights are scheduled from Turkey with UN-HCR relief items. Five B-747 flights are planned to leave from Turkey starting 25 October 05 till 30 October 05 with UN-HCR relief items.**

As of 24 October 2005, **38** EAPC nations have offered assistance to Pakistan on a bilateral basis, through NATO / EADRCC, through the EU Civil Protection Mechanism, through UN OCHA or other international organisations.

Nations willing to use the Alliance transportation capability are kindly asked to provide the following essential planning data by e-mail to the EADRCC:

- a. Nature of the item(s) to be shipped, e.g. tents, pumps, blankets etc
- b. Weight in kilograms
- c. Volume in metric
- d. Dimensions in metric
- e. Type of packaging e.g. bales, rolls, boxes, etc
- f. Whether palletised or not. If palletised, specify the type of pallet(s) e.g. Europallets or...etc
- g. If dangerous good e.g. HAZMAT etc
- h. Where ( location ) available for pick up and when ( specify the Date/Time/Group i.e. DTG) in GMT
- i. Is the shipper willing to move the items to be shipped to the designated point of loading
- j. Specify any other special instructions
- k. Specify a telephone of Point of Contact (POC), and if possible an alternative POC and the name of the person completing this questionnaire.

NOTE: It is important that each one of the 11 lines of the above questionnaire be completed. Please indicate NO if the answer is negative.

Nations are also invited to contribute airlift and sealift capability to NATO in order to expedite transportation of disaster relief from EAPC nations to Pakistan.
