

1. Situation update:

Relief efforts in north-eastern Pakistan are continuing with severe weather forecasted this week and a three-week window of opportunity to deliver winterised tents to the mountainous areas before the first snowfall. Presently an estimate of 200.000 family tents will be in country by the start of winter, sheltering half of 800.000 people believed to be without shelter.

According to UN estimates 75.000 people need urgent medical attention. The worst hit areas north east of Muzaffarabad in the remote valley areas remain inaccessible by transport. Limited assistance by mule trains or foot is provided. Nearly half of the 1 million people reportedly in need of food have received high energy food rations. Poor medical assistance has increased the rate of life-threatening infections. No outbreaks of disease have been reported as of 24 October 05.

Still there is an urgent requirement for helicopters, winterised tents (**estimated 60.000 delivered, 200.000 needed**), blankets/sleeping bags (2 million), water and sanitation (**600.000 latrines**), food assistance, water bladders for affected hospitals, generators and diesel, tarpaulins, ground sheets, stoves, kitchen sets, shovels ploughs, snow chains, antifreeze and urgent medical assistance.

Up to date NATO organised or operated 25 relief flights to Pakistan with 312 tons of assistance. Fourteen (14) additional flights are planned to arrive in Pakistan till 28 October 05 with additional relief items.

As of 25 October 05, 23 helicopters from NATO Allies are operating in Pakistan to help with the earthquake relief efforts. The United States plan to provide additional

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15 helicopters, bringing their total to 33. The United Kingdom has 3 and Germany has 2 helicopters deployed. At the end of this week Germany is replacing 2 helicopters with 4 others bringing the total to 40 helicopters to be deployed by NATO Allies.

As of 25 October 2005, 38 EAPC nations have offered assistance to Pakistan on a bilateral basis, through NATO / EADRCC, through the EU Civil Protection Mechanism, through UN OCHA or other international organisations.

Nations willing to use the Alliance transportation capability are kindly asked to provide the following essential planning data by e-mail to the EADRCC:

- a. Nature of the item(s) to be shipped, e.g. tents, pumps, blankets etc
- b. Weight in kilograms
- c. Volume in metric
- d. Dimensions in metric
- e. Type of packaging e.g. bales, rolls, boxes, etc
- f. Whether palletised or not. If palletised, specify the type of pallet(s) e.g. Europallets or...etc
- g. If dangerous good e.g. HAZMAT etc
- h. Where (location) available for pick up and when (specify the Date/Time/Group i.e. DTG) in GMT
- i. Is the shipper willing to move the items to be shipped to the designated point of loading
- j. Specify any other special instructions
- k. Specify a telephone of Point of Contact (POC), and if possible an alternative POC and the name of the person completing this questionnaire.

NOTE: It is important that each one of the 11 lines of the above questionnaire be completed. Please indicate NO if the answer is negative.

Nations are also invited to contribute airlift and sealift capability to NATO in order to expedite transportation of disaster relief from EAPC nations to Pakistan.
