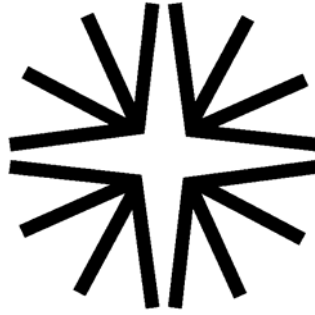

1. Summary:

A devastating earthquake struck Pakistan on 8 October 2005 causing more than 73.000 deaths, 70.000 injuries and leaving approximately 4 million homeless. On 10 October, the Pakistani authorities approached NATO with an official request for assistance. The same day, the Council requested advice of NATO Military authorities (NMA). On 11 October<sup>1</sup> the Allies agreed with the advice and later the same day the Operations plan (OPLAN) 10305 was agreed<sup>2</sup>.

OPLAN 10305 spelled out a staged approach to NATO's support to the humanitarian relief operation. The first stage focused on the air-bridge. The EADRCC, acting as a single point of contact, working in conjunction with NMAs, Pakistan authorities, UN-OCHA and the European Union, was tasked to coordinate all offers from NATO and Partner nations that requested NATO transportation assistance. The SHAPE Allied Movements Coordination Centre (AMCC) was responsible for the execution of the movement. NATO Response Force (NRF) tactical lift aircraft were used for repositioning aid supplies within Europe and also in a strategic role delivering aid directly to Pakistan, mainly UN goods from Turkey.

The EADRCC received the first request from the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) on 13 October 2005 to airlift 10.000 tents, 104.000 blankets and 2.000 stoves from Turkey to Pakistan. Several requests from UN agencies followed. In total 130 cargo flights transporting 2.245 metric tons of relief items to Pakistan were dedicated to

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supporting the UN. The first NATO relief flight to Pakistan arrived on 14 October. Priority was given initially to moving urgently needed tents and blankets, with the majority of the relief items being provided by UNHCR.

A total of 42 EAPC nations provided assistance to Pakistan, either on a bilateral basis, through the EU Community Civil Protection Mechanism or through the EADRCC.

Financial donations<sup>3</sup> and donations in kind<sup>4</sup> to the NATO air-bridge allowed the chartering of commercial airlift to significantly augment the fleet of NRF-assigned and NATO Airborne early warning training aircraft being employed. Eventually, 164 NATO controlled or coordinated relief flights delivering more than 3.224 tons of relief goods took place. The NATO relief flights constituted the largest single contribution to the airlift relief effort.<sup>5</sup>

The NATO air-bridge has been used by 19 EAPC<sup>6</sup> and 2 non-EAPC nations (Malta and Bosnia-Herzegovina) and by UNHCR, the World Food Programme (WFP) and the United Nations' Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UN-OCHA) and NGOs.

NATO military liaison officers were dispatched to the EADRCC and were embedded in the Centre's working structure. Civil experts from the SCEPC's Transport Planning Boards and Committees provided assistance from their places of work as needed.

The second stage began with the Council tasking on 17 October 2005 requesting NMAs to provide further military advice on a possible NRF deployment to Pakistan. In this connection, upon the request of the Pakistani authorities, the Secretary General decided to dispatch a Senior Civil Representative to liaise with the Pakistani authorities in Islamabad.

As of 9 February 2006, the NATO airlift to Pakistan had come to an end with the arrival of an AN-124 flight from Germany to Islamabad carrying 86,5 tons of relief goods (blankets, medical supplies and snow clearing equipment). On the day before, an IL-76 flight had transported the last of 42 tons of WFP tents from Oslo.

The NATO Secretary General has received letters from the Prime Minister of Pakistan and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees thanking for the extensive and timely humanitarian assistance provided to the victims of the 8<sup>th</sup> October earthquake.

Please find below, information regarding assistance provided. This EADRCC report covers only the humanitarian assistance provided by EAPC countries and summarises NATO relief flights to Pakistan.
