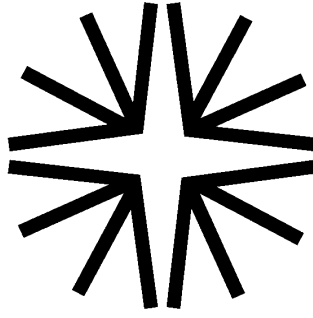

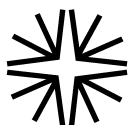

**1. Situation update:**

1.1 There is flood protection preparedness along Hungarian rivers on a total length of 3088 km: degree III. – reached the length of 1100 km, degree II. – the length of 709 km, degree I. – the length of 1049 km, extraordinary preparedness – the length of 230 km. The most serious damages caused by the floods are in Borsod-Abaúj-Zemplén, Győr-Moson-Sopron and Jász-Nagykun-Szolnok Counties.

1.2 Flood protection works are still ongoing in 15 counties and 286 settlements of the country, the number of response personnel is approx. 20,000; 90% of them work in Borsod-Abaúj-Zemplén County. Apart from the personnel of the water management and disaster management and the large number of volunteers, thousands of firemen, policemen, members of Hungarian Defense Forces, Customs and Finance Guard, penitentiary service take part in the flood protection works as well. Considerable national efforts are made in order to protect all the settlements against the complete destruction caused by the floods.

1.3 Defensive actions have been carried out in 12 of the 19 countries, in 259 towns by 21.490 persons. The number of evacuees on 7 June 2010 (6.00 PM) in 68 settlements is more than 5000; 95% of them live in Borsod-Abaúj-Zemplén County.

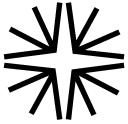
**3. Assistance provided/offered by EAPC Nations:**

3.1. **Switzerland** is providing 500.000 sandbags (40 x 70 cm) as a donation. The transport and the handover will be accompanied and organized (in agreement with the responsible person/s from your side) by a Swiss team consisting of 3 persons. This team is independent and self-organized, which means that no specific assistance / support from your Hungarian side is required. The assistance should arrive today at 2:00 pm by truck.

3.2. **Norway** will provide 323.000 sandbags (35x80cm) to the Hungarian authorities. The value of the sandbags are estimated at EUR 45.000. The bags will be transported in two 20 feet containers from Oslo Gardermoen airport to Papa in Hungary with a C 17 which is on a regularly flight mission not connected to the flooding situation, but has empty space. Estimated time of departure is early morning 10th of June. This will be at no cost for Hungary.
