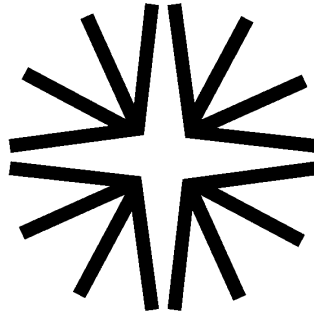

1. General Situation

1.1. A powerful 7.2-magnitude earthquake struck eastern Turkey on Sunday (23 October 2011). The earthquake activity process is still going on. Totally 1.792 aftershocks were recorded with magnitudes according to below list:

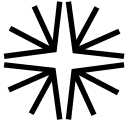
- 1.1.1 2 – 3 magnitude - 716 times;
- 1.1.2 3 – 4 magnitude - 913 times;
- 1.1.3 4 – 5 magnitude - 108 times;
- 1.1.4 5 – 6 magnitude - 7 times.

1.2 The death toll reaches 601 people, while the number of injured people reaches 4.100. The number of alive people who have been rescued by crews from the rubble is 231.

2. National resources available for disaster response and measures taken:

2.1. In total 4.448 search-rescue personnel, 1796 health personnel, 18 search dogs, 667 construction machinery and vehicles, 177 ambulances (7 of them air ambulances), 146 generators, 79 reflectors, 151 portable wc, 44.164 tents, 54 cluster tents, 109 tents for general usage, 60 pre-fabricated houses, 15 live containers, 11 field hospitals (6 of them are active), 170.495 blankets, 1.204 quilts, 11.184 food parcels, 37 portable kitchens, 3.051 kitchen set, 7.096 catalytic stoves, 5792 sleeping bags, 2310 Mevlana type pre-fabricated houses, 1 mobile oven and 13 tonnes food packages have been delivered to the region.

**3.31 According to the information from US EUCOM the USA Department of Defence has sent 5 planes to Turkey which arrived Erzurum International Airport on 29-31 October.**

**In total USA provided assistance to Turkey: 1366 blankets, 369 tents, 2782 cots and 525 sleeping bags.**

4. Points of Entry / Delivery:

4.1. Donated materials are to be transported by land to an “Assistance Delivery Center”, which is being set up in Van and a second one in Erzurum Airport for air transportation. It is important that assistance is delivered directly to these centers. Assisting countries should apply to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Turkey.
