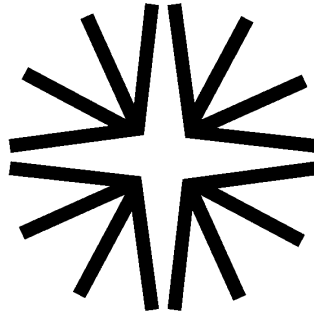

1. General Situation.

Type of the Disaster : Massive Snowfalls
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : beginning of 2012
Location of the Disaster : Northeast and Southeast of Albania

1.1. The weather situation is cloudy with rain. In North and South East parts of the country snow might fall during the rest of the 28 February 2012.

1.2. Presently 6 communes are still isolated (Shkodra Qark – 3, Qark of Kukes – 1 and Qark Korçe - 2). In district Bulqizë, Elbasan, Lezhe and Mirdite some villages are partly blocked and still aerial food supplies are needed. Communes are taking measures to access the internal rural roads and villages.

1.3. Roads blocked: Selce-Vermosh and main road to Iballa in Shkodra Qark. There is no access to point of Morava, Clirim and Novosele in Korça Qark.

1.4. Schools are closed in Shkodra Qark (Communa Iballë - 2 schools and communa Fierze - 2 schools) and Diber Qark (Zall Dardhe, Zall Rec Martanesh and Zerqan).

2. National resources available for disaster response and measures taken.

2.1. National, regional and communal emergency headquarters of Civil Emergencies have been set up and have intensified their activity due to harsh weather conditions. Fire and rescue service, emergency medical teams, police and special forces, helicopter units, regional support brigades and army are engaged in rescue, evacuation and other emergency activities.

2.2. Army helicopter wing has conducted 3 food supply missions in Dragobi Markegaj Tropoje and another 3 helicopters are to be sent to Bytyc.

4. Assistance provided by EAPC nations:

The Luxembourg Helicopter MD-902, which had arrived on 22 February 2012, finished its mission in Albania on 25 February 2012 and returned to Luxembourg. This helicopter was offered through the EU Civil Protection Mechanism.

5.1. Air - the International Airport of Tirana.

5.2. Sea - the Port of Durres.

5.3. Land lines of communication- Cross border point of Muriqan, Cross border point of Kakavija, Cross border point of Qafe Thana.
