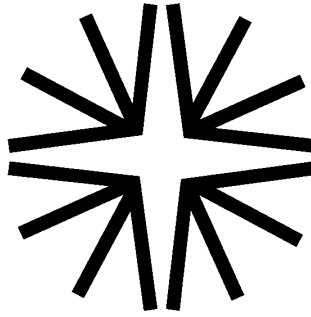


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EADRCC SITUATION REPORT N° 9 ON THE FLOODS IN ALBANIA

1. Update on the Situation in Albania

1.1. A state of emergency still remains in effect in ten Communes in two of the twelve Prefectures of Albania. According to information from the General Directorate for Emergencies, the situation is as follows.

1.1.1. Efforts are ongoing to repair roads in the Prefecture of Shkodra. The public sewage system has not been cleaned in some Communes of Shkodra, because of the lack of special cleaning equipment. The water and electricity supply has been re-established and is functioning. Distribution of humanitarian assistance, especially food continues in four affected communes.

1.1.2. The situation in the Prefecture of Lezha has improved and there are still about 200 hectares of agriculture land under water compared with 600-700 hectares mentioned in EADRCC SITREP No.8. Removal of water from the flooded areas goes on and will continue during the entire week.

1.1.3. In the other ten Prefectures the situation is under full control and all services for the population are functioning well. The LEMA is continuing the preparation of detailed damage assessment.

1.1.4. According to information from the General Directorate for Emergencies of Albania, a Governmental meeting is going to be held on Tuesday 22 Oct 2002 at which time the state of emergency is expected to be cancelled for the entire Albanian territory.

1.2. Except for occasional showers, there was no heavy rain during the last weekend on Albanian territory and the same weather is expected during the entire next week. The forecasted daytime temperature will vary from 18^o to 21^o Celsius.

2. National Response

2.1. At present there are a total of 50 personnel committed from both Albanian Armed Forces and Civil Protection Base. Also a total of 155 state employees personnel consisting of LEMA officers and others are involved in relief and recovery efforts.

3. Outstanding requirements for assistance

3.1. Albania still requires urgent EAPC nations' assistance with the provision of food, bedding items, detergents and special equipment, as mentioned below.

3.2. Food: Rice, oil, sugar, pasta and canned meat;

3.3. Blankets, beds and mattresses;



3.4. An urgent requirement for high pressure cleaning equipment (see par. 1.1.2.) and the roads reconstruction machinery (see par. 1.1.1.) exists;

3.5. Fans and portable dryers; and

3.6. Mesh for the strengthening of hillsides exposed to rain to prevent land and rock slides.
