1.1. At this moment, 5 Allied and 3 partner nations have requested international assistance through the Euro-Atlantic Disaster Response Coordination Centre (EADRCC). In chronological order of requesting, these are: Ukraine, Spain, Montenegro, Italy, Albania, The Republic of North Macedonia, the Republic of Moldova and Bosna and Herzegovina.

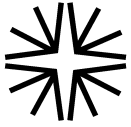

**4. Other bilateral offers of humanitarian assistance reported to the EADRCC**

- 4.1. The United Kingdom reported the following bilateral offers of assistance, related to the COVID-19 pandemic:
- 4.2. GBP 71 million previously announced for the research of vaccines and diagnostic tests, to support the World Health Organization and other international humanitarian organizations.
- 4.3. Up to GBP 150 million was announced in the Budget, for the International Monetary Fund's Catastrophe Containment Relief Trust (CCRT), to help developing countries meet their debt repayments so that they can focus their available resources on tackling coronavirus.
- 4.4. GBP 250 million of new UK aid funding for the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI) to help develop a vaccine.
- 4.5. GBP 50 million in a joint campaign with Unilever to tell up to a billion people about the importance of handwashing to stop the virus spreading in developing countries. The programme will also distribute over 20 million hygiene and cleaning products.
- 4.6. Repatriating of nationals of NATO countries as part of the repatriation flights organised from the US, Peru, Japan and China.
- 4.7. On Friday 3 March 2020, among a several tons heavy air transport also 50 ventilators sent by the German government arrived in Spain.
