

1. General situation

Type of the Disaster : COVID-19 pandemic

Date and Time the Disaster occurred : Ongoing

Location of the Disaster : NATO Allied and partner nations, and others

- 1.1. So far, five Allied and five partner nations have requested international assistance through the Euro-Atlantic Disaster Response Coordination Centre (EADRCC). In chronological order of requesting, these are: Ukraine, Spain, Montenegro, Italy, Albania, The Republic of North Macedonia, the Republic of Moldova, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Georgia, and Colombia.
- 1.2. This situation report only highlights confirmed developments since the last EADRCC Situation Report (OPS(EADRCC)(2020)0078(REV1)). An overview of the outstanding requests is available in Enclosure 1, attached to this document.
- 2. Completed bilateral offers of humanitarian assistance through the EADRCC

4. Other bilateral offers of humanitarian assistance reported to the EADRCC

- 4.1. Austria, through the EU Civil Protection Mechanism, has provided to Italy 3 360 litres (2 800 kg) of hand disinfection liquid.
- 4.2. Azerbaijan, bilaterally, has provided 10 000 medical masks to Hungary.
- 4.3. Poland, bilaterally, has committed 280 000 EUR to strengthening fire services in Georgia and Ukraine, in light of the COVID-19 crisis.
- 4.4. Poland, bilaterally, through its "Flight to Home" project, has contributed to the repatriation of 2 117 people from 29 NATO Allies and partners.
- 4.5. Poland, bilaterally, has provided 15 750 litres of sanitizing liquid to Italy and 5 040 litres to San Marino.
- 4.6. United States (US Army Europe) has assisted with the delivery of medical supplies to hospitals in northern Italy: approximately 100 hospital beds, 100 mattresses, 10 stretchers, 40 bedside screens, 25 adjustable IV poles, 25 medical cabinets, several folding wheelchairs, and 900+ linens.
